OSA AGM SUMMARY – continued

- **Tournament Rules: Formats** - Singles tournaments format to be 12 frames. Double tournaments format to be 16 frames
Numbering on scoreboards for doubles: – Many of us cannot see small frame numbers on the scoreboard, so we should now write each “round” number, at the left, as large as possible.. A doubles tournament of 16 frames (16 score-lines) is 8 rounds.
Third Game: In both Singles & Doubles, if a 3rd game is required to decide a match, switch colours halfway through. If still tied, in singles play two frames (one hammer each until tie is broken); in doubles play two frames (the same way.)
Charting: Charting is allowed only after all your practice discs have been shot.

THE OSA PLAYER POINTS SYSTEM

The OSA maintains point standings for players finishing in 4th-position or better, in OSA-sanctioned tournaments as follows:

Points for Amateurs playing in an AMATEUR or OPEN Tournament:

Main: 1st or 2nd - 1 point; 3rd or 4th - 1/2 point. Consolation 1st - 1/2 point.

An **Amateur** becomes an **Expert** after accumulating **five** points. Please see Page-8. for **Amateur point standings**.

Points for Experts playing in an OPEN Tournament: Main: 1st - 4 points; 2nd - 3 points; 3rd - 2 points; 4th - 1 point; Consolation: 1st - 1 point.

An expert may be inducted into the OSA Hall Of fame after reaching 35 points.

An **Expert** becomes eligible for the **OSA Hall Of Fame** (see page 10) after reaching **thirty five** points. Please see page-7 for **Expert point standings**.
